On July 27, 2016, Switch, Ltd. ("Switch"), filed a lawsuit in the United States District Court, District Court of Nevada, against the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada ("PUCN"), NV Energy, and various individuals, including Carolyn "Lina" Tanner, the former General Counsel for the PUCN (the "Lawsuit").¹

The lawsuit contains the following allegations: (1) failure to comply with Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS") 239.0107 and request for injunctive relief; (2) violation of Switch's right to equal protection under the Fourteenth Amendment; (3) violation of Switch's rights to due process under the Fourteenth Amendment; (4) unlawful state government action in violation of the Commerce Clause; (5) tortious interference with prospective economic advantage; (6) intentional interference with contractual relations; (7) deceptive trade practices under NRS 598.0903, et seq.; (8) fraud; (9) civil conspiracy; (10) conspiracy to commit fraud; (11) negligence; (12) gross negligence; and (13) personal liability pursuant to 42 United States Code section 1983.

Ms. Tanner was served on July 21, 2016. As of the date of this justification memo, the PUCN has not been served. On July 20, 2016, Ms. Tanner requested that PUCN counsel represent her in this matter (letter attached hereto as "Attachment 1").

In response to Ms. Tanner's letter, the PUCN requested direction from the Office of the Nevada Attorney General ("AG"). In a letter dated July 21, 2016 (attached hereto as "Attachment 2"), the AG responded that "the PUCN's in-house counsel must offer to represent Carolyn Tanner in connection with the Lawsuit...," citing NRS 703.164, which "allows the PUCN to employ legal counsel to, among other things, represent the Commission and its employees in legal proceedings.

Pursuant to that statute, the PUCN has, in fact, employed fill-time, in-house counsel to represent the PUCN and its employees in litigation."

On July 27, 2016, Ms. Tanner retained Mr. Kent Robison, Esq., with Robison, Belaustegui, Sharp & Low, to represent her in the Lawsuit. Ms. Tanner had to retain outside counsel due to potential conflicts with PUCN's in-house counsel representing Ms. Tanner as well as the PUCN, and due to statutory deadlines and court requirements that place limitations on PUCN in-house counsel's resources.

Due to the short timeframes for responding to the Lawsuit, and pursuant to the AG's recommendation that the PUCN provide counsel for Ms. Tanner, the PUCN contracted with Mr. Robison prior to receiving approval from the Board of Examiners. Therefore, the PUCN is requesting a retroactive effective date of July 27, 2016, for this contract.
