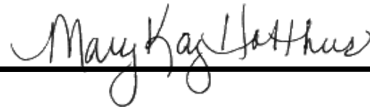
Petitioner, State of Nevada, Office of the Attorney General, Bureau of Consumer Protection (**BCP**), filed a motion on April 29, 2026, for leave to file a reply memorandum of points and authorities. Dkt. 156 (**Motion**). The Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (**Commission**) opposed the Motion, Dkt. 165. Nevada Power Company d/b/a NV Energy and Sierra Pacific Power Company d/b/a NV Energy (collectively, **NV Energy**) also filed an opposition to the Motion. Dkt. 166. NV Energy contended that should this Court grant the BCP's Motion, it should also grant leave to the Commission and NV Energy to file reply memoranda. *Id.* at 8. The Commission similarly made an "alternative request" for leave to file a reply memorandum should this Court grant the BCP's Motion. Dkt. 165 at 10. The BCP replied in support of the Motion and opposed the relief sought by the Commission and NV Energy. Dkt. 172. The BCP provided notice of its proposed reply memorandum, Dkt. 167, in response to which the Commission and NV Energy filed a joint objection, Dkt. 170. The Motion came before this Court for hearing on May 12, 2026. The Court, having considered the BCP's Motion, together with the papers and pleadings on file and the arguments presented at the time of hearing, and good cause appearing, orders as follows:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Petitioner's Motion for Leave to File a Reply Memorandum of Points and Authorities is GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Petitioner may file its proposed reply memorandum of points and authorities, and the Commission and NV Energy may file reply memoranda of points and authorities no later than May 19, 2026.

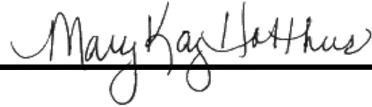
Petitioner, State of Nevada, Office of the Attorney General, Bureau of Consumer Protection (**BCP**), filed a motion on April 29, 2026, for leave to file a reply memorandum of points and authorities. Dkt. 156 (**Motion**). The Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (**Commission**) opposed the Motion, Dkt. 165. Nevada Power Company d/b/a NV Energy and Sierra Pacific Power Company d/b/a NV Energy (collectively, **NV Energy**) also filed an opposition to the Motion. Dkt. 166. NV Energy contended that should this Court grant the BCP's Motion, it should also grant leave to the Commission and NV Energy to file reply memoranda. *Id.* at 8. The Commission similarly made an "alternative request" for leave to file a reply memorandum should this Court grant the BCP's Motion. Dkt. 165 at 10. The BCP replied in support of the Motion and opposed the relief sought by the Commission and NV Energy. Dkt. 172. The BCP provided notice of its proposed reply memorandum, Dkt. 167, in response to which the Commission and NV Energy filed a joint objection, Dkt. 170. The Motion came before this Court for hearing on May 12, 2026. The Court, having considered the BCP's Motion, together with the papers and pleadings on file and the arguments presented at the time of hearing, and good cause appearing, orders as follows:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Petitioner's Motion for Leave to File a Reply Memorandum of Points and Authorities is GRANTED.

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1 provisions; in excess of the Commission's statutory authority; made upon unlawful
2 procedure; affected by other error of law; clearly erroneous in view of the reliable,
3 probative, and substantial evidence in the record; or arbitrary or capricious. The BCP
4 bears the burden of demonstrating that the Commission's final decision is invalid.
5 *Southwest Gas Corp. v. Public Utilities Commission of Nevada*, 138 Nev. 37, 41, 504 P.3d
6 503, 508 (2022).

7 The Court may not substitute its judgment for that of the Commission as to the
8 weight of the evidence on questions of fact. *Id.* at 40, 504 P.3d at 508. Where the
9 Commission's conclusions of law are closely related to its view of the facts, those
10 conclusions are entitled to deference and will not be disturbed when supported by
11 substantial evidence. *Id.* at 40–41, 504 P.3d at 508.

12 The Nevada Supreme Court has also recognized that ratemaking is a specialized
13 determination that does not fall neatly into traditional categories of fact and law, and
14 that the Commission possesses expertise in ratemaking matters that reviewing courts
15 lack. *Id.* at 42, 504 P.3d at 509. Accordingly, while the Court independently determines
16 questions of statutory interpretation, it may not reweigh the Commission's factual
17 determinations where those determinations are supported by substantial evidence.

18 DISCUSSION

19 The Court finds that the BCP has not demonstrated that the challenged decisions
20 are invalid under any of the criteria set forth in NRS 703.373(11). The Commission acted
21 within its statutory ratemaking authority and relied upon substantial evidence in
22 approving Nevada Power's daily demand rate and recovery of \$2.7 million in affiliate
23 charges and Sierra's use of fifteen-minute netting for future NEM customer-generators.

24 **A. The Commission Acted Within Its Statutory Authority.**

25 The BCP argues that the Commission exceeded its statutory authority in
26 approving the daily demand rate and fifteen-minute netting and that the Commission's
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28

1 authority is constrained by its obligation under NRS Chapter 704 to provide utility
2 customers with just and reasonable rates.

3 The Commission is legislatively charged with regulating public utility rates and
4 ensuring that rates and practices are just and reasonable. Its authority, however,
5 remains subject to the limitations imposed by the Legislature. The question before this
6 Court is therefore not whether the Court would have selected the same rate design, but
7 whether the Commission acted within the authority granted to it and consistently with
8 the governing statutes.

9 The Court finds that the BCP has not established that the Commission exceeded
10 its statutory authority in approving the challenged rate design and netting methodology.

11 **B. The Commission's Approval of the Daily Demand Rate Does Not Violate**
12 **Nevada Law.**

13 The BCP argues that the daily demand rate violates NRS 704.085(1), which
14 prohibits the Commission from approving a residential electric rate that is based upon
15 the time of day, day of the week, or time of year during which electricity is used, or which
16 otherwise varies based upon the time during which electricity is used.

17 The Court finds that the Commission-approved daily demand rate does not violate
18 NRS 704.085(1). The rate approved for single-family residential customers is a fixed
19 \$0.14 per-kilowatt rate. The rate itself does not increase or decrease depending upon the
20 time of day, day of the week, or time of year during which the customer's peak demand
21 occurs. A kilowatt of peak demand is subject to the same rate regardless of when that
22 peak occurs.

23 Although the resulting amount charged to a customer may differ depending upon
24 the customer's usage, NRS 704.085(1) prohibits a rate that varies based upon time. The
25 Commission-approved rate itself remains constant. The Court therefore concludes that
26 the BCP has not established that approval of the daily demand rate violates the statute.

1 The Commission's decision is also supported by substantial evidence. The record
2 contains evidence regarding the allocation and recovery of fixed distribution costs and
3 the cost shift between NEM and non-NEM customers. At the May 26 hearing, the Court
4 specifically addressed the evidence before the Commission concerning the allocation of
5 those costs and the effect of the approved rate design upon the majority of Nevada
6 Power's customers.

7 The Court does not independently determine that the Commission selected the
8 optimal rate design. Rather, because the Commission's material factual findings are
9 supported by substantial evidence, the Court will not reweigh that evidence or substitute
10 its judgment for the Commission's determination.

11 **C. The Commission's Approval of Fifteen-Minute Netting Does Not Violate**
12 **Nevada Law.**

13 The BCP argues that the plain language of the NEM statutes, including NRS
14 704.769, NRS 704.7732, and NRS 704.775, requires monthly netting.

15 The Court concludes that the BCP has not demonstrated that the Commission's
16 approval of a netting period shorter than monthly violates Nevada law. Nothing in the
17 cited statutes requires that a utility measure excess electricity only once during the
18 monthly billing period. The existence of a monthly billing period does not itself prescribe
19 the frequency or granularity with which electricity must be measured during that period.

20 The BCP further argues that the Commission should be bound by its 2017
21 determination concerning monthly netting. The Court is not persuaded. The
22 Commission's prior determination arose from a different proceeding and evidentiary
23 record. The Commission is not bound by stare decisis in the same manner as a court,
24 and the prior determination does not preclude the Commission from considering a
25 different netting methodology in a subsequent ratemaking proceeding based upon the
26 record then before it.

1 The Court likewise declines to conclude that legislative inaction following the
2 Commission's 2017 determination establishes a statutory requirement of monthly
3 netting. The Court therefore finds that the BCP has not established that the
4 Commission's approval of fifteen-minute netting violates Nevada law.

5 The Commission's decision is also supported by substantial evidence in the
6 administrative record. The Commission considered evidence regarding modern
7 advanced-metering capabilities, the manner in which monthly aggregation treats
8 electricity generated and consumed at different times, and the effect of fifteen-minute
9 measurement upon NEM compensation.

10 In particular, the record contains evidence that monthly netting aggregates
11 periods in which customer generation and consumption may have different effects upon
12 the electrical grid, while fifteen-minute netting measures net generation more
13 frequently. The record further contained evidence concerning the anticipated financial
14 effect of the change upon new NEM customer-generators. The Commission also
15 considered evidence that Sierra's existing metering technology records customer
16 electricity usage in fifteen-minute intervals and that use of those intervals therefore
17 accords with Sierra's existing metering practices.

18 Under NRS 703.373(11), the Court may not substitute its judgment for that of the
19 Commission as to the weight of this evidence. The BCP has therefore failed to establish
20 a statutory or evidentiary basis for setting aside the Commission's approval of fifteen-
21 minute netting.

22 **D. The Commission's Approval of the Daily Demand Rate and Fifteen-Minute**
23 **Netting Is Supported by Substantial Evidence.**

24 The administrative record contains substantial evidence supporting the
25 Commission's findings concerning the effect of the existing rate structure upon NEM and
26 non-NEM customers and the Commission's decision to adopt the daily demand rate and
27 fifteen-minute netting.

1 The Commission received evidence that approximately ninety percent of Nevada
2 Power’s residential customers—those without rooftop solar systems—were paying more
3 than their allocated share of costs under the existing structure and that the cost shift
4 had reached approximately \$50 million annually. The Commission also considered
5 evidence that participation in NEM had increased approximately 32% over the precedin
6 two years, at a rate substantially exceeding overall customer growth. The Commission
7 further considered evidence that the daily demand rate would reduce the identified cost
8 shift by more accurately allocating fixed distribution-related costs among customers.
9 Those matters were among the evidentiary findings specifically discussed by the Court
10 at the May 26 hearing.

11 The Court does not determine independently whether the Commission’s chosen
12 policies constitute the preferable method of allocating those costs. The Court finds only
13 that substantial evidence in the administrative record supports the Commission’s
14 material factual findings and that the Court therefore may not substitute its judgment
15 for that of the Commission as to the weight of the evidence. See NRS 703.373(11);
16 *Southwest Gas Corp.*, 138 Nev. at 40, 504 P.3d at 508.

17 **E. The Commission’s Approval of Nevada Power’s Recovery of \$2.7 Million in**
18 **Affiliate Charges Is Supported by Substantial Evidence.**

19 The BCP argues that substantial evidence does not support the Commission’s
20 approval of \$2.7 million in affiliate charges and that the Commission’s decision was
21 arbitrary and capricious.

22 The record reflects that Nevada Power requested approximately \$21.269 million
23 in affiliate charges. The Commission did not presume those charges were prudent or
24 approve the amount requested. Instead, the Commission expressly found that Nevada
25 Power “did not sufficiently support all of the affiliate charges” and that investigations
26 conducted by the BCP and the Commission’s Regulatory Operations Staff revealed
27 deficiencies in Nevada Power’s review process. The Commission ultimately allowed
28

1 recovery of only \$2.7 million, thereby rejecting the substantial majority of the amount
2 requested.

3 The record contains substantial evidence supporting the amount ultimately
4 allowed. Nevada Power submitted MDR-32, a dataset containing 71,457 individual
5 affiliate-charge transactions. The record also reflects that, after millions of dollars in
6 charges identified as imprudent were removed, approximately \$6.7 million in audited
7 affiliate transactions remained unchallenged by the BCP. The \$2.7 million ultimately
8 allowed by the Commission was less than half of that amount.

9 Thus, the Commission did not simply accept Nevada Power's requested affiliate
10 charges. The administrative process resulted in the disallowance of more than \$16
11 million of the amount originally sought after the BCP and Staff identified deficiencies in
12 Nevada Power's review process. The Commission ultimately concluded that the record
13 demonstrated at least \$2.7 million in reasonably incurred affiliate charges.

14 The Court does not independently presume that Nevada Power's affiliate charges
15 were prudent, nor does it reweigh the evidence supporting individual transactions.
16 Applying the standard set forth in NRS 703.373(11), the Court finds that substantial
17 evidence supports the Commission's determination permitting recovery of \$2.7 million
18 in affiliate charges and that the BCP has not established that the determination was
19 arbitrary or capricious.

20 **ORDER**

21 The Court's determination is based upon the administrative record presented for
22 judicial review. That record reflects extensive discovery, expert testimony, documentary
23 evidence, and evidentiary hearings before the Commission. Although the parties vigorously
24 dispute the weight and significance of that evidence, NRS 703.373(11) does not permit this
25 Court to substitute its judgment for that of the Commission as to the weight of the evidence
26 on questions of fact where the Commission's findings are supported by substantial evidence.
27 For the foregoing reasons,

1 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the State of Nevada, Office of the Attorney General,
2 Bureau of Consumer Protection's Petition for Judicial Review is DENIED.
